ATTENTION RESIDENTS

Please be aware that an Ordinance has been passed regarding RENTAL PROPERTIES.

The following are some of the requirements:

~Landlords within Town limits must have a Residential Property Owner Business License with the Town.

~Rental Properties must be registered with the Town.

~Rental Property Inspections must be conducted by the Town.

~A Tenant Registration Form must be submitted before a unit is rented.

A full copy of the Ordinance is available on our Town Website, as well as the required forms.

If you need a paper copy of either the Ordinance or the forms to register a property, please contact the Town Hall.

For existing Rental Properties, please contact the Town Hall and submit the required forms as soon as possible.

There have been several other new Ordinances and updated Ordinances put into place in the last few Council Meetings. Please take the time to look over them, and ask any questions you may have at the Town Hall.


